Directions to OneCard Office

To get to the OneCard Office (and the Service Hub) from Yonge/Dundas intersection:

- Proceed north on Yonge St.
- Turn right onto Gould St.
- Turn left onto Nelson Mandela Walkway.
- Proceed to the first entrance to the Library building on the left. Don't have a OneCard yet? Use the buzzer at the building entrance to buzz and inform security that you are here to get your OneCard.
- Once in the building, stay on the ground floor for the OneCard office (procede to the 2nd floor for the ServiceHub).
- Proceed to the right and continue down the hallway (almost the entire length of the building) until you reach POD-48 on the left side, where the OneCard Office is located.

As a Program for 50+ Student you can get a free Student OneCard – Toronto Metropolitan University's official photo ID card. To be eligible for a OneCard, you must be enrolled in a course in the current academic term.
